

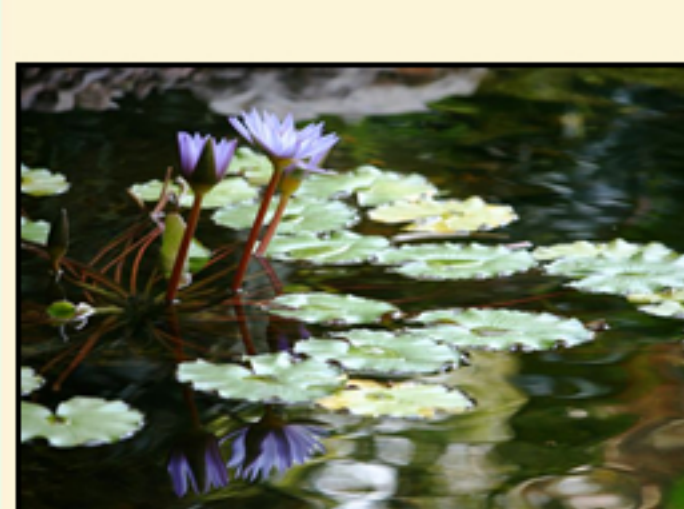

JULY IS—Independence Day (4th of July), fireworks, Mosquitoes, aquatic midges, pond tours, Koi shows, dirt bikes, and swimming in your recreational (Microbe-Lift) pond, perhaps... 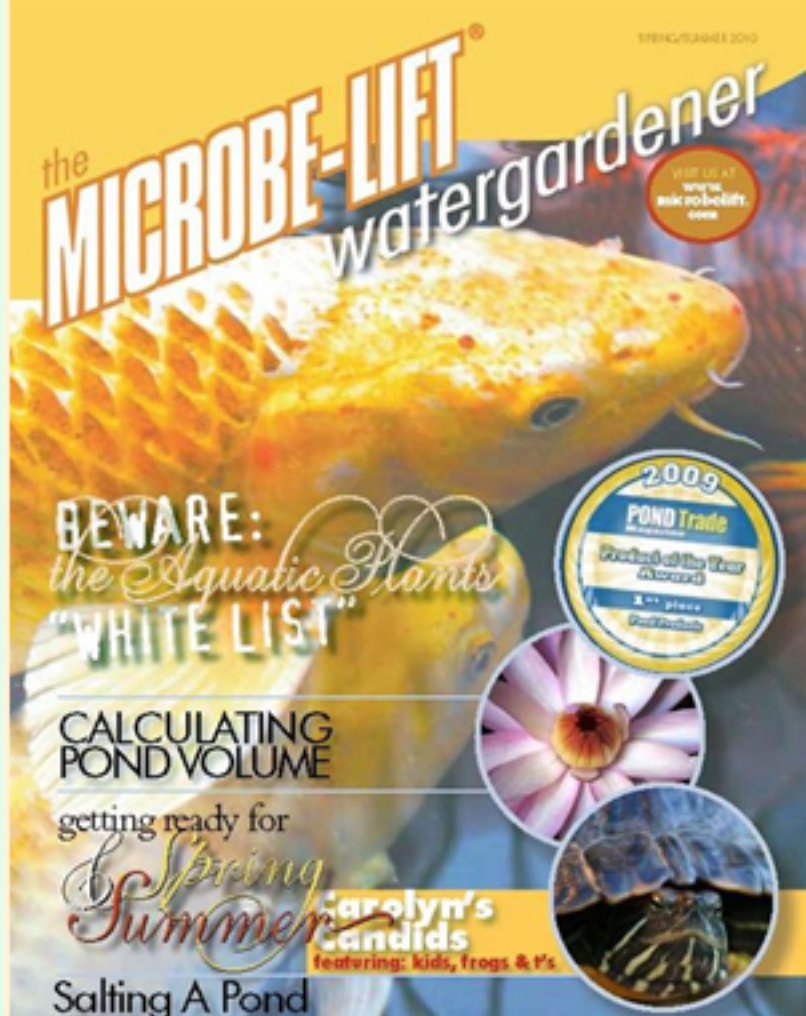

IN THE SOUTH

When lightning strikes or a hurricane is on the horizon be prepared for the worst and hope for the best! Microbe-Lift/Ammonia Remover can be a life-saver when the power goes out. DID YOU KNOW?

Feeding is not recommended over 90F for Koi. Their metabolism is not regulated for temperature extremes and begins to shut down below 50 and above 85. These are "temperate zone" fish.

KOI are not carnivorous. They do not eat their young once they are recognizable as (Koi) fish. They do not try to eat each other. They are social and peaceful fish.

GOLDFISH can spawn every two weeks. Did you know that? NO wonder the pond seems crowded. And the babies are generally born BLACK... So, now you know.
